

FIRE SAFETY GUIDE FOR USERS OF ELECTRIC MICROMOBILITY VEHICLES

MAIN FIRE HAZARDS

Improper storage or charging of electric micromobility vehicles (electric scooters, electric skateboards, electric unicycles, hoverboards, etc.) equipped with lithium-ion batteries can pose a serious risk to people and property. To prevent or reduce the risk of fire, it is important to follow the safety requirements below.

PROHIBITED:

- Do not store or charge electric micromobility vehicles in corridors, stairwells or other escape routes.
- Do not store or charge electric micromobility vehicles near flammable materials or objects.
- Do not charge electric micromobility vehicles where they may be exposed to direct sunlight or high temperatures.
- Do not charge electric micromobility vehicles when their cooling vents are covered or obstructed.
- Do not use chargers with damaged, worn or excessively hot cables.
- Do not leave an electric micromobility vehicle unattended while it is charging.
- Do not modify electric micromobility vehicles or use them contrary to the manufacturer's instructions. Such misuse may affect your legal and/or commercial warranty rights.

ACTIONS THAT MAY HELP PREVENT FIRES:

- Use only certified electric micromobility vehicles that are in good technical condition, and always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- If instructions are not provided, ask the seller to provide all necessary information about the product and its safe use.
- Charge the vehicle only with the original charger intended for that product and according to the charging instructions specified by the manufacturer. Do not leave the vehicle charging overnight.
- Do not modify electric micromobility vehicles.
- Do not remove or disable speed or power limiters.
- Switch off the battery when the vehicle is not in use.
- Protect the battery from impacts, deformation and other damage.
- Do not use an electric micromobility vehicle if its battery is damaged, swollen, deformed, becomes unusually hot while charging, or gives off a burning or plastic smell.
- Only charge electric micromobility vehicles using an electrical installation that is in good technical condition.

SAFETY MEASURES

- Keep appropriate primary fire-fighting equipment available, such as a fire extinguisher suitable for use on electrical equipment.
- If an electric micromobility vehicle catches fire, do not attempt to extinguish it while it is connected to the mains electricity supply.
- Keep electric micromobility vehicles in areas equipped with smoke detectors or a fire detection and alarm system.
